

SUBJECT: Environmental Commitment Statement

1. The scope of this Environmental Commitment Statement, which is a key element of the installation's Environmental Management System (EMS), includes all the activities, services and products under the installation command authority of the 99 ABW. This command authority covers Nellis Air Force Base (AFB), Nevada Test and Training Range (NTTR), and tenant units.
2. The Environmental Policy Statement is a commitment to conducting the mission in an environmentally responsible manner that will protect human health and the environment. We will comply with all environmental laws, regulations, and Air Force instructions applicable to the conduct of our mission. This commitment goes beyond compliance and encompasses the integration of sound environmental practices into our daily decisions and activities. In support of our EMS, we will:
  - a. Strive for continual improvement in our environmental performance and stewardship, and ensure exceptional stewardship of natural and cultural resources and protect the quality of air, water and resources.
  - b. Set strong but realistic environmental goals, measure progress, communicate results via the Cross Functional Team and Environmental, Safety, and Occupational Health Council.
  - c. Maintain an effective sustainability program to identify and implement potential pollution prevention initiatives to reduce waste generation and reuse materials and equipment by advertising to other bases before disposing any waste in an environmentally responsible manner.
  - d. Work in partnership with all stakeholders – installation personnel, contractors, the Southern Nevada community, tribal and regulatory agencies – to promote effective environmental stewardship initiatives.
3. Supporting this Environmental Commitment Statement is the responsibility of every member of the Nellis-NTTR complex, in accordance with his/her roles and responsibilities in the organization.
